This work is intended to supplement the Vital Records of Plymouth, NH. The plan is to have all persons with the same family name in one place with enough information to identify each one. The researcher would then go to the Vital Records of Plymouth, NH, compiled by Bagley and Vacca, for more complete information. Births, marriages and deaths are included in the same alphabetical list under the family name.

Deaths of married women are included twice, once under their maiden name and once under their married name. Where there is no maiden name given, the entry is under the married name. When women have been married before, the second marriage record will include their maiden name and their first marriage name (ex. Smith, Bertha [Eaton]).

Other information about Plymouth families will be found in the Vital Records of the Town of Campton, , and in the cemetery lists, for Plymouth, Holderness, Campton, Ashland, Bridgewater, Ellsworth, Rumney, Hebron, and Foster Cemetery in Wentworth. All of these works transcribed by Bagley and Vacca.

These records are those found in Plymouth Town Reports from 1940 through 1967. After 1964, the records are selective in that not all entries of Plymouth town vital records are included, but only those believed by the town clerks to be pertinent. Many of the entries pertaining to families from the surrounding towns are included because of the location of Speare Memorial Hospital. The Vital Records of Plymouth will give the locations from which the person came.

Care should be taken to consult the original records before entering in genealogies since all transcriptions are subject to mistake. The information on the vital records, especially the spelling of names, is not always accurate, or consistent, especially with non-Anglo-Saxon names, and, sometimes, even with them.
